ROLL CALL

Mayor Khubesrian convened the Regular Meeting of the South Pasadena City Council/Redevelopment Successor Agency (Agency)/Public Financing Authority (Authority)/Housing Authority (Authority) at 7:35 p.m.

Chief Deputy City Clerk Hall called the roll. Present were City Councilmembers/Agency/Authority Members Cacciotti, Mahmud, and Schneider; Mayor Pro Tem/Agency/Authority Vice Chair Joe; and Mayor/Agency/Authority Chair Khubesrian.

Absent: None.

Other Officials and Staff present: City Clerk Zneimer; City Manager/Agency/Authority Executive Director Gonzalez; City Attorney/Agency/Authority Counsel Adams; Assistant City Manager Straus; Police Chief Miller; Deputy Fire Chief Riddle; Finance Director Batt; Assistant Finance Director Lieu, City Librarian Fjeldsted; Public Works Director Toor; Planning and Building Director Watkins; Water Conservation Analyst Figoni; Grants Analyst Perkosky; Senior Planner Mayer; and Chief Deputy City Clerk Hall.

INVOCATION

Mayor Pro Tem Joe presented the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Pro Tem Joe led the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. CLOSED SESSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

City Attorney Adams reported that at 6:30 p.m., Mayor Khubesrian called to order the Closed Session Meeting of the City Council of March 19, 2014. He stated all Councilmembers were present. City Attorney Adams reported there was no one from the public wishing to speak on the Closed Session agenda items. He stated Mayor Khubesrian recessed the meeting into Closed Session to discuss the following items as listed on the Closed Session Agenda: 3) Conference with Legal Counsel, Existing Litigation, Pursuant to Government Code Section 54956.9(d)(1), Name of Case: City of South Pasadena v. Robert C. Winters, Diane Lee Alari, Case No. GS O14 444; and 4) Conference with Legal Counsel, Anticipated Litigation, Pursuant to Government Code Section 54956.9(d)(4), Number of Potential Cases: One. City Attorney Adams announced there was no reportable action on either item.

2. PRESENTATION OF A CERTIFICATE OF RECOGNITION TO DEVIN GRAB, SOUTH PASADENA ATHLETE, FOR HER ACHIEVEMENTS IN ATHLETICS AND ACCEPTANCE TO UCLA WATER POLO TEAM

Mayor Khubesrian noted that Devin Grab could not be present to receive her Certificate of Recognition, and that it would be mailed to her.

3. PRESENTATION OF A CERTIFICATE OF RECOGNITION FOR THE SOUTH PASADENA VARSITY VOLLEYBALL TEAM, 2013 RIO HONDO LEAGUE CHAMPIONS

Mayor Khubesrian presented a Certificate of Recognition to two team members of the South Pasadena Varsity Volleyball Team for the 2013 Rio Hondo League Champion.

4. PRESENTATION OF A CERTIFICATE OF RECOGNITION TO ALISON E. FARRAR FOR BEING NAMED AS A CANDIDATE IN THE 2014 U.S. PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Mayor Khubesrian presented a Certificate of Recognition to Alison E. Farrar for being named as a candidate in the 2014 U.S. Presidential Scholars Program.

5. PRESENTATION OF A CERTIFICATE OF APPRECIATION TO FORMER MAYOR FLETCHER SWAN FOR THE DONATION OF HISTORICAL ARTIFACTS AND PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE SOUTH PASADENA SANTA FE DEPOT FOR AN UPCOMING SOUTH PASADENA LIBRARY EXHIBIT

Mayor Khubesrian noted that Former Mayor Fletcher Swan could not be present to receive his Certificate of Appreciation, and that it would be presented at a future City Council meeting.

6. COUNCILMEMBERS' COMMENTS (3 MINUTES EACH)

Councilmember Schneider announced the South Pasadena Tournament of Roses fundraising event "Spring Fling" to be held on Saturday, March 22, 2014, at the War Memorial Building, from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Mayor Pro Tem Joe announced he attended the March 6, 2014, Southern California Association of Governments meeting of all policy committee members regarding the topic of California's water drought issues.

Councilmember Mahmud announced that she attended the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments' (SGVCOG) Energy, Environmental and Natural Resources Committee (Committee) meeting. She reported that the Committee will present to the SGVCOG's Board of Governors, a recommendation to approve AB 1331 regarding the water bond. Councilmember Mahmud also announced the following events: 1) SGVCOG will be sponsoring a free Transportation Forum on Wednesday, March 26, 2014, at 8:30 a.m., at the Pacific Palms Hotel in the City of Industry; 2) Hike and Bike Tour of the Hahamongna Water Shed, sponsored by the Arroyo Seco Foundation, on Saturday, March 22, 2014, at 9:00 a.m.; and 3) Water Conservation Analyst Figoni is hosting a Water Wise Landscape Workshop on Saturday, March 22, 2014, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., and on Thursday, April 3, 2014, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

Councilmember Cacciotti announced that Water Conservation Analyst Figoni is available to visit residents to provide landscaping assessments and recommendations. Councilmember Cacciotti requested that staff follow up on the following items: 1) Send letter regarding water leak to 1831 Ramona Avenue (west side of street); 2) Check sprinkler in median on Fair Oaks Avenue at Lyndon Street for water overspray; 3) Sprinklers on during mid-day hours at the church at 1316 Lyndon Street; 4) Oak tree on Fair Oaks Avenue at Columbia Street leaning over onto traffic lane; 5) Replace tree stump in median on Fair Oaks Avenue with new tree; 6) Review red curb area on Meridian Avenue at Mission Street to allow for closer passenger drop off. Councilmember Cacciotti requested an ordinance be considered limiting the time vehicles can idle. Councilmember Cacciotti indicated he visited the library and Emergency Operations Center, and noted that additional building space is needed. He congratulated Deputy Fire Chief Riddle on his recent promotion.

Mayor Khubesrian provided an update on the Senior Center's Dial-A-Ride Program. She requested the reallocation of \$500 of her discretionary funds to The Place, previously allocated for a mural at the Senior Center, seconded by Councilmember Cacciotti.

City Librarian Fjeldsted announced the unveiling of the Children's Hour artwork created by artist Merrell Gage on March 21, 2014, at 1:00 p.m., and invited the public to attend. Mayor Khubesrian announced that the City of South Pasadena (City) received an A+ score from the Los Angeles Conservancy Preservation Report Card for its historical preservation policies, and an information slide was displayed. Mayor Khubesrian stated

she traveled to Sacramento with City Manager Gonzalez, Lisa Pendleton, Secretary, Women Involved in South Pasadena Political Action representative, and Lisa Boyd, Moms for Family and Community representative, to participate in a press conference with mayors, city officials, and public safety officials from other cities. She testified in front of a joint committee of the Senate and Assembly that is overseeing the Sunset Review process for the California Massage Therapy Council (CAMTC). Mayor Khubesian commented that she attended the Los Angeles County Mayors' Conference with City of Los Angeles Mayor Garcetti. She also participated in a radio interview with Larry Mantle, Host of Air Talk, 89.3 KPCC, regarding the topic of massage establishments.

7. CITY MANAGER COMMUNICATIONS

City Manager Gonzalez announced the City's Budget Kick-Off meeting for the public would be held on Wednesday, April 16, 2014, at 6:30 p.m. City Manager Gonzalez announced that Public Works Director Toor would provide an update on the Wilson Reservoir Replacement Project. Public Works Director Toor provided a PowerPoint presentation on the Wilson Reservoir Replacement Project and responded to Councilmembers' questions.

Councilmember Schneider requested that the March 5, 2014 Special City Council Meeting Minutes regarding the General Plan be revised to include Councilmember Mahmud's comment that the General Plan needs editing and not a complete revision.

14. AWARD OF CONTRACT TO GENERAL PUMP COMPANY FOR PUMP TESTING OF THE WILSON WELL #2 PROJECT

In response to Councilmember Cacciotti's question, Public Works Director Toor provided the number of wells and background information on the project.

MOTION: M/S Cacciotti/Mahmud to approve the Award of Contract to General Pump Company for pump testing of the Wilson Well #2 Project. By roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously. Absent: None.

15. AWARD CONTRACT IN AMOUNT OF \$60,160.77 TO CREATIVE BUS SALES FOR PURCHASE OF MV-1 CNG VEHICLE FOR DIAL-A-RIDE PROGRAM USING AB 2766 SUBVENTION FUNDS

In response to Councilmember Cacciotti's question, Grants Analyst Perkosky provided a status report on the MV-1 CNG vehicle currently being used for the Dial-A-Ride Program.

MOTION: M/S Mahmud/Cacciotti to approve Award of Contract in the Amount of \$60,160.77 to Creative Bus Sales for Purchase of MV-1 CNG Vehicle for Dial-A-Ride Program using AB 2766 Subvention Funds. By roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously. Absent: None.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mayor Khubesrian opened the public comments section of the meeting.

Amber Flores, Member of South Pasadena Girl Scout Troop #9491, requested a proclamation designating May 2014, as “Mental Health Awareness Month” in the City of South Pasadena.

MOTION: M/S Joe/Cacciotti to approve the placement of a proclamation on a future City Council meeting agenda to declare May 2014, as “Mental Health Awareness Month” in the City of South Pasadena.

Shlomo Nitzani, South Pasadena resident, requested that the Public Comments section be moved to the beginning of the meeting agenda, and that time limits be applied to City Council. He attended the Public Works Commission meeting and commented on the installation of red curbs. Mr. Nitzani suggested the installation of no parking signs.

There being no additional speakers, Mayor Khubesrian closed the public comments section.

PUBLIC HEARING

16. FIRST READING AND INTRODUCTION OF AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE SOUTH PASADENA MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING SETBACK REQUIREMENTS FOR DETACHED GARAGES AND CARPORTS

Senior Planner Mayer presented the staff report and responded to Councilmembers’ questions.

Mayor Khubesrian opened the Public Hearing.

Anthony George, Chair, Planning Commission, indicated he was available to respond to Councilmembers’ questions.

In response to Councilmember Cacciotti’s question, Planning Chair George stated the main purpose to amend the setback was to increase the usable space of a lot. He explained the proposed two foot setback was based, to a certain degree, on a historical number. He believed the City’s municipal code, in the past, had a two foot setback minimum; however, it was changed to align with the fire code. He indicated two feet is a common number for older homes with detached garages.

In response to Mayor Pro Tem Joe's question, Planning Chair George stated that a garage could not be changed into another accessory structure, per the municipal code, and would preclude any noise issues.

There being no additional speakers, the Public Hearing was closed.

Councilmember Mahmud indicated opposition to a two foot setback; she proposed a three foot setback be considered.

Mayor Khubesian stated the Planning Commission discussed the setback and provided a recommendation. She indicated opposition to a three foot setback and has received feedback from residents that they would like to maximize their lots.

Chief Deputy City Clerk Hall presented and read by title AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CALIFORNIA, (AMENDING SECTION 36.350.170(C)) OF THE SOUTH PASADENA MUNICIPAL CODE TO ALLOW REDUCED SETBACK REQUIREMENTS FOR DETACHED GARAGES AND CARPORTS PROVIDED CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS ARE MET.

MOTION: M/S Cacciotti/Joe to approve a first reading and introduction of AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CALIFORNIA, (AMENDING SECTION 36.350.170(C)) OF THE SOUTH PASADENA MUNICIPAL CODE TO ALLOW REDUCED SETBACK REQUIREMENTS FOR DETACHED GARAGES AND CARPORTS PROVIDED CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS ARE MET. The motion passed by the following roll call vote:

ACTION/DISCUSSION

17. DIRECTION REGARDING AMENDING SOUTH PASADENA MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 5.26, NUMBER OF DOGS WHICH MAY BE KEPT BY AN INDIVIDUAL

Police Chief Miller presented the staff report and responded to Councilmembers' questions.

Mayor Khubesian opened the Public Comments section.

Werner Hintzen, resident, South Pasadena, indicated opposition to an increase in the number of dogs allowed to be kept by residents.

Beverly Biber, resident, South Pasadena, commented that she believes barking dogs are not an issue and indicated support for an increase in the number of dogs to be kept by residents.

There being no additional speakers, Mayor Khubesrian closed the Public Comments section.

Mayor Khubesrian indicated support for an increase in the number of dogs to be kept by residents.

Councilmember Mahmud proposed that the municipal code requirement to provide proof of “extraordinary circumstances” be changed to “good cause.”

There was consensus among the City Council to revise the municipal code language as recommended by Councilmember Mahmud.

Councilmember Cacciotti provided the following clarification to the language in Municipal Code Section 5.26 as follows: 1) Remove “extraordinary circumstances” and replace with “good cause;” and 2) Remove “City Council” and add “City.”

MOTION: M/S Mahmud/Cacciotti to amend the South Pasadena Municipal Code (SPMC) Section 5.26 – Number of Dogs Which May be Kept by an Individual and to modify the SPMC language as follows: 1) Remove “extraordinary circumstances” and replace with “good cause;” and 2) Remove “City Council” and add “City.” By roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously. Absent: None.

18. DIRECTION REGARDING PROHIBITING SINGLE-USE PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAGS

Water Conservation Analyst Figoni summarized the staff report as part of a PowerPoint presentation, and responded to Councilmembers’ questions.

Councilmember Mahmud stated the Chamber of Commerce supports the prohibition on the use of plastic bags.

Mayor Khubesrian opened the Public Comments section.

Rody Stephenson, resident, La Cañada Flintridge, expressed support for the proposed ordinance to ban the use of plastic bags.

There being no additional speakers, Mayor Khubesrian closed the Public Comments section.

Discussion followed among the City Council and staff regarding the \$0.10 charge for paper carryout bags, and the number and type of stores that would be subject to the ordinance.

Councilmember Mahmud recommended that the City Council consider adopting Los Angeles County's Environmental Impact Report (EIR) instead of performing an addendum to the EIR.

MOTION: M/S Cacciotti/Joe to approve the drafting of an ordinance prohibiting single-use plastic carryout bags for City Council consideration at a future meeting, and to adopt Los Angeles County's Environmental Impact Report. By roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously. Absent: None.

19. FIRST READING AND INTRODUCTION OF AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 35 OF THE SOUTH PASADENA MUNICIPAL CODE TO ADD WATER SHORTAGE PLANS AND WATER CONSERVATION PROVISIONS

Water Conservation Analyst Figoni presented the staff report and responded to Councilmembers' questions.

Mayor Khubesian opened the Public Comment section.

There was no one wishing to speak; therefore, the Public Comment section was closed.

Councilmember Mahmud recommended that the City Council either consider mandatory, minimum levels of water conservation percentages and refer the ordinance back to the Natural Resources and Environmental Commission (NREC), or consider their deletion.

Councilmember Schneider stated he attended the NREC meeting when this matter was discussed. He indicated the discussion on water conservation percentages was difficult for the NREC. He stated the percentages were controversial and would be difficult to enforce.

Nancy M. Wilms, Commissioner, NREC, stated the NREC was asked to provide specific water conservation percentages.

Councilmember Mahmud retracted her recommendation to refer the ordinance back to the NREC. She stated that since the ordinance was a first reading and introduction, it did not need to be reviewed again by the NREC.

Chief Deputy City Clerk Hall presented and read by title AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 35 (WATER) WITH THE ADDITION OF ARTICLE IV (WATER CONSERVATION AND SUPPLY SHORTAGE PLANS) AND ARTICLE V (VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES) AND AMENDING SECTIONS 35.13 (DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE –FOR FAILURE TO PAY BILL) AND 35.14 (DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE –FOR NONCOMPLIANCE WITH RULES AND REGULATIONS) OF ARTICLE 1 OF CHAPTER 35 (WATER) AND REPEAL SECTION 35.33 (WATER WASTE) OF THE SOUTH PASADENA MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO WATER CONSERVATION AND SHORTAGE PLANS AND ENFORCEMENT.

MOTION: M/S Mahmud/Cacciotti to approve a first reading and introduction of AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 35 (WATER) WITH THE ADDITION OF ARTICLE IV (WATER CONSERVATION AND SUPPLY SHORTAGE PLANS) AND ARTICLE V (VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES) AND AMENDING SECTIONS 35.13 (DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE –FOR FAILURE TO PAY BILL) AND 35.14 (DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE –FOR NONCOMPLIANCE WITH RULES AND REGULATIONS) OF ARTICLE 1 OF CHAPTER 35 (WATER) AND REPEAL SECTION 35.33 (WATER WASTE) OF THE SOUTH PASADENA MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO WATER CONSERVATION AND SHORTAGE PLANS AND ENFORCEMENT and to strike all language referencing water conservation percentages in South Pasadena Municipal Code Sections 35.74, 35.75, and 35.75. The motion passed by the following roll call vote:

20. RUBBISH AND WATER UTILITY RATE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Assistant Finance Director Lieu summarized the staff report as part of a PowerPoint presentation, and responded to Councilmembers' questions.

Mayor Khubesrian opened the Public Comments section.

Werner Hintzen, resident, South Pasadena, stated he previously provided comments and data to the City Council regarding market value of properties participating in the rubbish rate reduction program. He stated his interpretation of the data is that more than half of the residents in the City were subsidizing participants of the rubbish rate reduction program, who have a higher housing standard of living than non-participants.

Mayor Khubesrian closed the Public Comments section.

Discussion followed among City Councilmembers and staff regarding asset based program reviews, income based program reviews, and income thresholds.

MOTION: M/S Mahmud/Cacciotti to approve the proposed income eligibility criteria, with the removal of the multi-unit housing from program eligibility. By roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously. Absent: None.

MOTION: M/S Schneider/Joe to approve a 40% discount for both the rubbish low-income program and water low-income program, and to provide a status report to the City Council in six months. By roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously. Absent: None.

MOTION: M/S Cacciotti/Joe to approve an effective date of July 1, 2014, for both the rubbish and water low-income programs. By roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously. Absent: None.

21. RESOLUTION ADOPTING A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR THE ARROYO SECO PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLE TRAIL PROJECT

Public Works Director Toor presented the staff report and responded to Councilmembers' questions.

Councilmember Mahmud thanked Councilmember Cacciotti for spearheading the allocation of funding from the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy.

In response to Councilmember Mahmud's question, Public Works Director Toor indicated the construction costs for the project are estimated to total \$1.8 million dollars. He stated the grant would cover 25% of the project's costs.

MOTION: M/S Cacciotti/Joe to adopt **Resolution No. 7339** for the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Arroyo Seco Pedestrian and Bicycle Trail Project.

22. APPROVAL OF APPOINTMENTS TO THE AD HOC DOWNTOWN PROJECT ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND UPDATED RESOLUTION

Assistant City Manager Straus presented the staff report. Assistant City Manager Straus explained there were two vacancies and one transfer. He requested consideration to appoint the following individuals:

1 at-large Business and/or Property Owner within 500 feet of Project Site: Ellen Daigle

MOTION: M/S Cacciotti/Joe to approve the aforementioned appointments to the Ad Hoc Downtown Project Advisory Committee; and adopt the updated **Resolution No. 7340.**

23. ESTABLISH AD HOC COMMITTEE FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

City Manager Gonzalez presented the staff report and responded to Councilmembers' questions.

Mayor Khubesrian opened the Public Comments section.

Bianca Richards, resident, South Pasadena, commented that she supports the formation of the Ad Hoc Committee for Economic Development.

Mayor Khubesrian closed the Public Comments section.

By consensus, the City Council approved the establishment of the Ad Hoc Committee for Economic Development, and appointed Mayor Khubesrian and Mayor Pro Tem Joe as the Councilmember liaisons.
